Memory Information. Your Mac Pro has two memory cards with four memory slots on each card (in four banks of two each). Your Mac Pro comes with a minimum of 2 GB of memory, installed as a pair of 1 GB fully buffered dual inline memory modules (FB-DIMMs) in two of the DIMM slots. You can install additional pairs of 1 GB, 2 GB, or 4 GB FB-DIMMs in the open DIMM slots on the memory cards, for a total of 32 GB of memory.
